SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

Each semester will normally have six core and one non-core paper and each shall be for 100 marks. The composition of theory and internal assessment marks for each paper will be 60 and 40 respectively.

Every theory paper shall ordinarily consist of two/three sections, developed to testing of conceptual skills, understanding skills, comprehension - skills, articulation and applications Skills. In case of theory papers the various components of internal assessment will be as follows:

Assignment —10 marks

Attendance — 10 marks

Internal Test - 20 Marks (The first test shall be for I .5 hours duration carrying 40 marks. The second will be pre-finals of sixty marks with the duration of 3 hours.

ETHICS

CODE OF CONDUCT
